It has been a very busy few weeks here in school and plans are well under way to start the installation of the new kitchen before the end of term. We will be planning some trial weeks for hot meals and sandwich lunches so that we can test the viability of providing this service.

Like breakfast club and After School Club, which were both provided in response to parent requests, hot lunch provision has to be self-funding and an accurate measure of the demand is essential at the planning stage. The wrap around care we provide is cheaper than that provided by local schools, yet still it is unlikely to be able to continue in the current format unless the community has an ongoing use for it.

I really believe passionately in providing high quality, good value food options for the children and am committed to establishing this in our school. With everyone's support I am sure we will see this firmly established by the new academic year.

Two new school teams turned out last week, and did a fantastic job of representing us. The netball team played in their first tournament (only the second time they had seen a court!) and won two of their matches; and the showjumping team competed at Heazle Farm on Sunday. We had a team of 4 and got through to the second round with 12 faults. Hetty and Daisy completed 2 clear rounds each, and Charlotte and Henry Scott completed a very successful team effort.

The Cross Country runners also did extremely well on Monday, with our first relay team finishing 7<sup>th</sup> and our fastest three runners coming in the top 15 individually. These were Henry Scott, Rich Baker and Ben Luxton. Everyone ran well and no-one gave up in the cold and muddy conditions, which was very impressive. Thanks are due to the parents and brothers and sisters of all those competing for the school, who had to endure freezing conditions at all three events. (Some of them at all three!)

Well done to Miss Wood and Mrs David for getting their team ready for the matches and to Caroline Moore for organising the riding team.

If any of you would be interested in organising a sports activity, I would very much appreciate it, and can organise relevant training if needed. The more opportunities of different types we offer our children the more chance they have of finding a sport they can enjoy.
